T3: Programme Regulations 2024-2025

Certificate of Higher Education in Christian Ministry and Mission (180 credits)

- 1. This programme is available at Emmanuel Theological College in full-time mode of study over one and a half years, or in part-time mode of study over two years.
- 2. Candidates shall study and be assessed in modules to a total of 180 credits, with no more than 120 credits at Level 4, and a minimum of 60 credits at Level 5.
- 3. Modules in this programme utilise a range of assessment types, and methods of delivery:
- (A) In-person learning sessions: Students enrolled on this Common Awards programme receive inperson tuition for either some or all modules. Modules for full-time students are typically taught entirely in-person.
- (B) *'Blended' learning sessions:* Teaching to dispersed part-time cohorts utilises shared 'blended' classrooms. A tutor will lead a learning session live from a teaching centre to one part-time cohort situated at two locations. Half of the class is based in the room with the tutor, the other half is based at another teaching centre participating via video link with a 'host' in the room to facilitate. The host's role is to maximise potential for student engagement and participation within the learning session. The tutor will divide contact hours evenly between the two teaching locations during the module to ensure parity of experience for all.
- (C) Online learning sessions: Some modules are taught entirely online to small, dispersed cohorts of part-time students (e.g. contact hours for Independent Learning Projects).
