All SAEX Programs

- Two application rounds a year
 - Semester 1 (February June)
 - Semester 2 (July November)
- Study for one or two semesters
- Enrol in three or four subjects (courses) from any discipline areas
- Undergraduate and graduate programs available
- Live on or off campus





Exchange Program

- Available to students nominated by our exchange partners
- Students pay tuition fees to their home universities

Study Abroad Program

- Available to students from any university
- Students pay tuition fees to the University of Melbourne










- Students can enrol in these subjects once they have accepted their offer to study at Melbourne


Terminology



Entry Requirements (UK)

- **Grades:** at least a 60% average
- Students need to have completed two semesters of full-time study before commencing at Melbourne
- Some subjects have pre-requisites
- Students need to meet **home institution requirements**

Exchange Program Fees


Students pay tuition fees to their home universities.


