What is a placement year and what are the requirements?





- Minimum 40 weeks in length
- Professional level work experience
- Self-sourced
- Usually between 2nd & 3rd year
- Formally assessed on a pass or fail basis
- Usually paid
- 20% tuition fee covers pre-placement and on-placement support plus access to usual student benefits
- Assigned academic placement tutor
- Important! You have to successfully pass level 2

- Trial your future career

- Secure a grad offer
- Build a network
- Go global: discover a new city or country





Global Opportunity Definitions

Placement Year

- An OPTIONAL additional year to your degree
- Typically taken between your 2nd and 3rd year
- Can be within the UK or anywhere internationally (so long as it is safe to do so)
- Professional level work experience
- Pass or Fail, doesn't affect your overall degree outcome
- Assessed on employability skill progression through reflective learning
- 20% tuition fee

Study Abroad

- An OPTIONAL additional year to your degree
- Taken between your 2nd and 3rd year
- You will visit a University in an exchange agreement with Durham University
- You apply for a place through the Study Abroad processes
- Depending on the agreement the year may or may not count towards your final degree outcome
- Assessed on academic achievement for the year
- 15% tuition fee

Year Abroad

- A MANDATORY additional year to your language degree
- Taken between your 2nd and 3rd year
- Must be abroad in a country that speaks your target language(s)
- You can opt to either study or work or a combination of both
- Pass or Fail, doesn't affect your overall degree outcome
- Assessed on your language skill progression
- 15% tuition fee



International placements: checklist

- If the placement is outside the UK, please visit the <u>Embassy of the</u> <u>country you are travelling to</u> in order to find out which visa to apply for and how to apply
- Be aware of language requirements
- Check terminology: placement versus internship
- Ensure that the placement opportunity is aligned with the UK academic year and starts in the summer (Jun Sep)
- Be aware that international placement salaries differ greatly; they should still meet local NMW or equivalent if available
- Please do not use agencies!





Speculative Applications



Speculative Applications

- Speculative applications are used to approach employers directly, even when they aren't advertising a vacancy.
- The process usually involves sending a speculative covering letter and a CV which highlight the kind of role you are seeking and your relevant skills and knowledge.
- As well as researching the employer, think about the skills and experience the employer might be looking for – you will need to identify these as there is no job description to refer to.



Reaching out to employers

- Either via LinkedIn, by email or phone
- Ensure that your profile is up to date and complete
- Send an invitation, once accepted you will be able to send your intro message





Funding, Fees and Finance

To support students with global opportunities there is a range of support in terms of **Fees**, **Finance** and **Funding**:

- Fees: tuition fee reductions are in place for Placement Year and Study Abroad students.
- Finance: Students can still apply for Student Finance and receive their Durham Grant.
- Funding: Many Global Opportunities are self-funded, however, there are number of additional funding sources that can support students. Additional support may also be available for students that may have entry barriers, such as caring responsibilities, medical support costs or who are from disadvantaged groups.

Get in touch with Faculty Placement Manager to let them know that you have secured

Step 1

Step 2

Log onto PebblePad and complete the Placement Info Form https://v3.pebblepad.c o.uk/login/durham You must attend a mandatory Pre-Placement Briefing or 1:1

Step 3

You need to complete a risk assessment, occupational health form and VIATOR submission

Step 4

Step 5

We will ask your placement host to sign a legal agreement (employer & public insurance)

You will still need to register on Banner Self Service for next year and apply for Student Finance
