

4.0	Matters Arising from Minutes	
	 TB confirmed that there were no comments on the Terms of Reference. TB confirmed that the management system is complete. 5.0	My Greenspace Movement Update	
	 The Greenspace Movement is a movement that everyone can join, individuals can win £20, and teams can donate £200 to a chosen charity. An estimate of 64.2 tonnes of CO2 has been saved. There have been 224 journeys made via sustainable travel and 24.9 tonnes of CO2 avoided. Travel Buddy scheme was soft launched in Easter last year. More people than last year are now car sharing. Car share parking bays are being investigated. TB raised that by the end of the year, targets will be made which will be around £15,000.

New proposal – Using EcoCampus Management System to identify risks. This group will be focused on the strategic issues. Further updates will be provided in due course. 	
	 The aspects and impacts register will provide the top performing activity. The score will be worked through by the team. The tracker will help keep numbers to a low to be able to clearly read through at ESSPG meetings. The wider indicator will still be kept to refer back to as a whole. LJ confirmed that in the future there will be a new process to roll out disposable 	
	cups and start using reusable cups.

	 26th in people and planet score – world class University A gap analysis has been completed to find out where the short fall is. There is still room for improvement and EcoDU are campaigning for a Carbon Management plan. There were issues raised regarding bins and members of the public not using them correctly. This will be investigated by TB.

10.1	Integrated Sustainable Travel Plan

	 New cycle sheds have been approved at UEC for Stephenson College. Allen Armstrong and Alfie Wallace have created a policy with YF. This will be sent for approval. 	
	 A high number of EV chargers will be at Boldon House. In the first 2 months of the year, there have been around 10 bike thefts per month recorded. 	
	 Improvements are being made to the park & ride at Howlands. The transport plan for DUBS Waterside building will be discussed at the Project Board by DWL. 	DWL



	 Issues were also raised regarding the location of the Waterside building and that it is far for students who are used to the location of DUBS. 	
	The targets for the Waterside building are exceeding expectations.	
10.2	Estates Decarbonisation Group	
	 Progress is being made to decarbonise the estate. Roofing works are currently being undertaken at Maiden Castle and Josephine Butler. Emissions will be lowered by almost half by the University. Streams are being investigated for LED lighting. This is currently a working 	
	 progress. There has been a grant for academic members of staff to undertake a project to see if we could generate heat from mines underneath Durham. 	
10.3	Catering & Procurement Update	
	 Reusable cups will be made available through Retail. College bars will also receive reusable cups. There has been a push to ensure students are working more sustainable within the bars. The aim of this is to ensure that students are ready for when the new legislations come into place. Catchments in River Wear to dispose of waste. This usually includes plastics 	
	 and bottles. The main goal is to find a way that littering can be decreased. DWL raised that we could try and influence shops around the surrounding Durham area to use reusable items. 	
	 Durham pound – looking at what the best value is regarding financial and environmental. 	
	There have been investigations around carbon rating on menus. Each item gets rated A-D.	
	 A new process has been brought in to investigate how non-catering colleges can reduce food waste. The University uses both To Good To Go and To Good To Throw. 	
	 A meeting was held with BidFood to investigate in season food rather than freighting food.
