APPLICATION SUBMITTED FOR 148 NEW CHILTON HOMES

DURHAM COUNTY Council has received an application for a proposed development of 148 new homes on the edge of Chilton.

The plans, put forward by local businessman John Wade, are for outline consent for a development on a 6.7 hectare site at Blue House Farm, off Denebridge Row, which is currently a farmstead and agricultural land.

The application proposes 29 four bedroomed detached houses, 43 three bed detached, 50 three bed semi-detached properties and 26 affordable houses in varying sizes and styles, including a small number of bungalows; all with off-street parking.

Agent Carter Jonas states that the scheme will boost housing supply on a 'windfall site' previously not allocated for housing.

The site would be accessed from two new entrances, one opposite Denebridge Row and another from the unnamed main road which leads to Kirk Merrington.

Consultation on the application closes on 19th March with a decision expected by Tuesday 21st May.

SPECIALIST SCIENCE CLASSROOM OPENS IN CHILTON

A SPECIALIST classroom designed to nurture pupilled scientific investigation across six primary schools has officially opened.

The facility, based at Chilton Academy, is the

first Ogden Trust 'Phiz Lab' in the North East of England and is supported by Durham University and Approach Too CIC.

Phiz Labs are dedicated science teaching spaces shared between several

schools, aimed at promoting pupil-led scientific experiments and helping schools work together.

Funding has come from The Ogden Trust, a charity dedicated to promoting the teaching and learning of physics.

The new facility will be used by The Ogden Trust Primary Partnership schools: Chilton Academy, Cleves Cross Pri-

CHILTON COUNCIL AGREES TO **2% TAX INCREASE**

AT THE January meeting members of Chilton Town Council agreed to increase the Council tax by 2% from the 1st April 2019.

This equates to an increase for band A of £2.84 over the year which is 0.04p per week. Band D properties £4.27 per year which is 0.08p per week

The Mayor, Councillor M. Young stated "Members in setting this year's budget considered all issues affecting the Town Council during the 2019 -2020 civic year. We were aware of the impact on our residents and limited the rise to 2%

"In taking the decision members considered the current rate of inflation at 2% the fluctuation costs of utilities and staff pay increases during April. My members are proud to be supporting residents in the provision of community events and we continue to support the Miners Welfare Charity".

ADVENTURE IN NEPAL

AS PART of the 'Adventure in Nepal' project, two teachers from Ferryhill Business & Enterprise College, Mrs Emma Woodhall and Mr Thomas Young, went to Kathmandu, Nepal in February 2019.

The project, which started in September 2018, set out to introduce Global Learning with schools around the world to help young people develop the knowledge, skills and attitudes needed to thrive.

On 14th February Mrs Woodhall and Mr Young set off to Nepal to meet the partner school. In true Nepalese style they were greeted with an array of flowers, shawls and other gifts. The school had also put on an elaborate performance of traditional and modern songs and dances, as well as a fashion show.

included trip meetings with senior leaders in the school to exchange teaching and learning ideas for professional development and there was also the opportunity to teach. The school took Mrs Woodhall and Mr Young on a tour of its 6 blocks, which accommodates 2,500 students from 3 years to 18 years old.

Nightingale International School has been awarded many awards for its excellence in teaching and in 2015 Nightingale's long awaited dream came true. It was declared "the best school" amongst all the schools in Nepal.

Mr Kevin Brennan, head teacher at FBEC said: "I am delighted that we are part of such an enriching project that will not only provide many opportunities for the students, staff and the school, but also highlight the importance of intercultural communication and

education in a global world."

The project, run by the British Council, is part of a larger plan to be lead school in a cluster of schools around the world. FBEC will work with schools across the UK and around the world to help young people develop the knowledge, skills and values to take action on and support the achievement of the "Sustainable Development Goals".

It will allow Mrs Woodhall and Mr Young to deliver global learning activities as well as invite teachers from the partner schools to teach students at FBEC.

In July, FBEC will welcome two members of staff from the Nightingale school in Nepal, who will be given the chance to share good teaching practice and also have the opportunity to work with some of FBEC's students.

Staff and students from Durham University will help teachers and pupils with hands-on experiments and longer-term scientific investigations.

University Business Durham, the economic development organisation for Durham, also train and support young 'Science Ambassadors' - pupils in each of the schools whose role is to inspire their classmates in science.

Mark Roberts, Assistant Head Teacher at Chilton Academy, said: "This exciting partnership has already brought the schools in our cluster group closer together in terms of the way our pupils work in a collaborative manner.

"We also hope that this opportunity to use the Phiz Lab space and resources, combined with the expertise of science specialists in their field from regional businesses and universities, will help us to provide our pupils with scientific skills and knowledge that they can pass onto their peers. Additionally, we truly hope that our students will perceive science as an exciting, fun and innovative career option in the future."

An opening ceremony was held on Friday 1 March, when pupils from each of the schools enjoyed a Celebration Science show from children's entertainer Cool

Each school's Science Ambassadors also presented activities, posters and displays for the Phiz

The door for the new facility was designed by Stuart Trotter, current author/illustrator of the Rupert Bear children's stories.

Emily, one of the pupils at the launch event, said: "So inspired: I want to be a scientist!"

Clare Harvey, CEO of The Odden Trust, said: "We are delighted to celebrate the opening of this new Phiz Lab, with so many partners and science ambassadors able to attend.

"The Ferryhill and Chilton cluster group of primary schools has had a really active ambassadors' programme and this is now the icing on the cake for pupils to have a special place to learn and practice their science skills "

Dr Lorraine Coghill, Ogden Science Outreach Coordinator in the Department of Physics at Durham University, said: "It's fantastic to be part of such an inspiring partnership and see the first Phiz Lab in North East England open right here in County Durham.

"The Phiz Lab will allow for new and exciting STEM programmes within the communities of Chilton and Ferryhill and we're excited to be involved.

"The Science Ambassadors already have plans for hands-on workshops for families and to help younger pupils learn through experiments they have developed with our staff and students."

A total of 5,485 applications were made this year, up from 5,162 in 2018, and every single child has been offered a place at a school in the county.

Out of these applicants 5,143 have been successfully placed into their first choice, which equates to 93.8 per cent. Overall 98.3 per cent of children have been placed in their first, second or third choice school.

County Council's Cabinet member for children and young people's services, said: "It is fantastic that the vast majority of children in County Durham will go to their first choice of secondary school in September. I wish them the best of luck for their future education."

TOGETHER APART' DOCUMENTARY BRINGS PEOPLE TOGETHER

OVER 120 people went along to Chilton and Windlestone Sports and Social Club for the première of the Chilton and Windlestone - Together Apart documentary, and it's accompanying photographic exhibition.

Over a year in the making and with hours and hours of work behind them, the project team were blown away by the response.

The documentary and photographs provided those that went along with, as one person put it. 'a fantastic afternoon of memories and conversation, bringing together old friends and new'.

A spokesperson for the event said: "Before the event officially opened at 1pm there were already 40 people in the Club's 'big hall' looking through the photographs and, although the event should have finished at 3pm, there were still old friends chatting and discussing what they had just seen at 3.45pm.

"The documentary lasted 45 minutes and covered home and village life, school, after school, music film and work

"It took the crowd on a journey that today we would think of as difficult, but to the ladies and gents interviewed indicated 'they were the best

"The photos told a similar story of two villages separated by a railway line and a pit heap, but what they both showed were strong, resilient, friendly (at times) and happy people who loved their villages and thoroughly enjoyed the fifties."

There was such a demand for copies of the documentary that the project team have decided to develop a website where they will upload the photos and documentary, with a few extras thrown

CELTIC RUN LEAGUE LEADERS CLOSE AHEAD OF SECOND DERBY DAY

FOLLOWING LAST week's local derby win over Dynamoes, Ferryhill Celtic were back in league action against league leaders Pelton Roab on Sunday 3rd March.
