

Challenge 1: **What is the Norman Chapel?**


1. Fill in the missing words:

3. Can you match each carving to the animal they represent?




Challenge 2: **Repair & Care**




1. What material is the Norman Chapel made from. Circle the correct answer.

1. Can you put these builder's tools into the right tool box? **Hint some are in both.**



Challenge 5: Food, banquets, and pets




Archaeologists have found lots of **animal** bones at Durham Castle.
